RESOLVED, that Hearing Officer Alfred T. Riccio was duly appointed to hear and consider certain charges filed pursuant to New York Civil Service Law § 75 in regard to Mark Rossley, employee of the Town of Bovina, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board herewith duly acknowledges receipt of the findings and recommendations of the Hearing Officer in that matter and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby accept the Findings of Fact and Recommendations of Hearing Officer Alfred T. Riccio, of Brownville, New York, dated February 9, 2011, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the services of Mark Rossley be and the same hereby are terminated, effective February 15, 2011.

Highway Superintendent, Robert Burgin made the recommendation to dismiss the services of Mark Rossley under the terms of the hearing officers recommendations effective February 15, 2011.

Councilman McIntosh said that the Board needs to work on the water problems in the water district. He went door to door with Water Superintendent Choquette on February 14, 2011 to try to locate a leak. The

water user policy needs to be updated. Supervisor Molé said that she has to send a yearly water report and will include a letter with a contact form and the obligations of the water users in that mailing. McIntosh said that Choquette is very conscientious. He brought an employee from the Village of Delhi Water Department in for 4 hours on February 15th to help him try to locate the problem. McIntosh said that you have to be careful this time of year shutting water off. Councilwoman Stewart feels that the policy needs to be enforced. Molé said that a fine needs to be set. Stewart said that the fine should be set per day.

Highway Superintendent Burgin said that he would like to see the homeowners with fire hydrants in their yards, adopt those hydrants. There is a need to have the hydrants shoveled out and made accessible in the winter months. Burgin said it's to the homeowner's best interest to keep the hydrants free of snow. Supervisor Molé asked if it was up to the County to clear them if they're in the County right-of-way.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:28 PM.
